
Title:	Berth 2 East – Maintenance Works

Planned works:

Contractors Bridge Pro Engineering (BPE) will be undertaking works underneath and in the vicinity of Berth 2 East. The works will include the installation of scaffolding and work platforms above the waterline.

All installations will be clear of the water to avoid damage from waves and propellor and thruster wash and are to be inspected prior to departure each day and prior to commencement of works each day. BPE will monitor VHF Channel 14 and make the following VHF and/or telephone calls when mobilizing to and from Berth 2 East.

Prior to mobilization or at any time during the day when returning to Berth 2 East

- Obtain confirmation from the Master or Duty Officer of the SeaRoad vessel alongside that it is safe to proceed to the berth/wharf and that all propellor and thruster wash has cleared.
- Contact VTS for permission to proceed to the berth.

When departing Berth 2 East and when completing works for the day.

- Contact VTS for permission to depart the Berth.
- Contact the Master or Duty Officer of the SeaRoad vessel alongside with confirmations of either the duration of the work break or completion of works for the day.

If at any time it becomes unsafe or if instructed to do so by the Master of the SeaRoad vessel, or VTS, then BPE are to clear the area immediately and advise when clear. BPE are to check and monitor the scheduled departure times of the SeaRoad vessels and in any case, confirm at 1200 each workday that the scheduled departure time for the vessel has not come ahead.

In order to allow statutory safe testing of main engines and bow/stern thrusters, BPE are to be clear of the Berth no later than 45 minutes prior to the scheduled departure time of the SeaRoad vessel.
